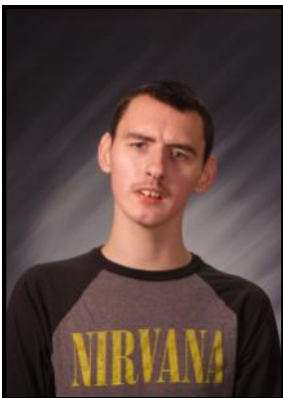

BOARD ROOM BRIEFING

The Lorain County Board of DD convened at 6:30 p.m. on June 26, 2017:

Murray Ridge Program Specialist Jim Nagy presented the Board with a generous donation from Mega Championship Wrestling, proceeds from the Breaking Down Barriers 7 event in May, which was enjoyed by many consumers of Murray Ridge alongside other wrestling fans from the local community. Board Member Dan White announced that the Board Award Committee has selected a nominee to receive the next Exceptional Service Award; this award will be presented at a staff meeting in August. The Board unanimously approved a contract and proposal that will enable a local housing corporation to access state funds for housing for individuals moving out of an intermediate care facility (ICF/IID), and a contract that will enable individuals leaving developmental centers and other ICF/IIDs to access state funds for rental assistance. The Agency Chain of Command policy was revised. Superintendent Fisher provided updates related to the State Biennium Budget, and Board Member training options.
