About 1 in 54 children has been identified with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) according to estimates from CDC's Autism and Developmental Disabilities Monitoring (ADDM) Network. She is now having to use a rollator to get around and going down the steps of the apartment building has become too difficult for her, so she has asked Jack for months to go and get her mail from the apartment complex mailbox and bring it back to her. He has done this, as well as taking the newspaper each day for more than a year to a frail woman on the 3rd floor (who has since passed away) so she could avoid the stairs. Knowing Jack and seeing what he has been doing for these women in his apartment complex makes me so proud of him. He does it every day and never says a word for recognition – but I feel he deserves recognition."

If you haven't received your COVID vaccine yet, go to the Lorain County Public Health website at loraincountyhealth.com/signup


At that site you'll find the latest information on how to sign up for appointments at area vaccine clinics and how to use the ArmorVax app to help you with scheduling your appointments.

#### **BOARD ROOM BRIEFING**

#### The Lorain County Board of DD convened at 6:30 p.m. on March 29, 2021

Board member Dan White announced that the Exceptional Service Award Committee had selected two nominated Murray Ridge employees to receive the next quarterly Exceptional Service Award. In consideration of factors including a directive from the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities to this year significantly reduce the number of Medicaid waiver recipients served in the county board-operated Adult Day Program, the Board prioritized groups with regard to who would be able to continue in/return to Murray Ridge Adult Services; there will be SSA contacts with impacted individuals/families, and anyone not able to return to/continue with Murray Ridge Adult Services will be assisted to explore options and secure an alternative provider of day services. The Board unanimously approved a policy revision enabling certain individuals who receive Supported Employment, but not OVC-based services from Murray Ridge to also receive Adult Services from other providers. The Board approved a revision to its policy on Behavior Support. Superintendent Fisher provided a historical overview of subsidies and charges for Murray Ridge Preschool Program participants with special needs, and the Board established rate structures for parents of typically developing children and school districts that place students in the Murray Ridge Preschool Program for the 2021/2022 school year. Dr. Fisher also provided updates on the plans for the Murray Ridge School modified prom, commencement exercises and summer program.
