The Murray Ridge Preschool Program recently earned a 5-Star rating for meeting the quality standards established by the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services and the Ohio Department of Education. **Step Up to Quality** is a Five-Star Tiered Quality Rating and Improvement system created to recognize and promote early learning and development programs that meet quality standards over and above the health and safety licensing requirements.

Murray Ridge Preschool offers students with a variety of developmental disabilities the advantages of inroom therapies, an array of state-of-the-art equipment, outstanding staff, and an opportunity to learn alongside typically developing peers.

The Preschool Program runs Tuesday through Friday. Children with disabilities must be referred to the Murray Ridge Preschool Program by their local school districts. Sheffield Lake Parade 'Summer Shenanigans'





Consumer Profile — Meet Melissa 'Missy' Skidmore

Missy is a kind and accomplished woman who is supported to live the life she chooses. Missy's Service and Support Administrator (SSA), Sandy Desai, who is an employee of Murray Ridge Center, assists her with development of an Individual Service Plan that identifies the supports Missy needs to be happy and healthy, and the providers of her various services. Sandy also monitors Missy's services, and helps her to keep her plan up-to-date as her needs and desires change. Missy's services are funded through Medicaid, and 'local match money' is used by Murray Ridge to 'pull down' the federal Medicaid funds.

Missy has lived in small group settings in Lorain County since 2004, and recently moved into a new home in Amherst. Her SSA coordinated necessary bathroom modifications in the new home to enable Missy to remain as independent as possible. Missy lives with three friends, and their landlord is Murray Ridge Housing Corporation (MRHC). Missy receives supports in her home through Our Lady of the Wayside (OLW), an organization that has served local residents with developmental disabilities for more than fifty years. OLW assists Missy with life tasks such as cooking, cleaning, personal care, keeping medical appointments and following doctor's recommendations.



Missy enjoys family style meals, and loves to cook for herself and her housemates. She also loves to be out and about, and OLW supports her to engage in many activities in the community. She stays fit by working out at a local gym several days a week. Missy particularly enjoys going shopping, to parks, out to eat, to concerts, to Cedar Point, to the Cleveland Zoo, to casinos, to baseball games, and bowling. Her favorite thing this past year was seeing the Backstreet Boys in concert!

Missy reports that, at her day program, she enjoys arts and crafts, computer programs, games, exercising, socializing and learning life skills. CECO also assists Missy to volunteer at a local food pantry, and to engage in a variety of activities in the community.

Missy thrives on spending time with family and friends. She visits with her mother regularly, and also enjoys visiting other family members who live nearby, particularly her nieces and nephews. Missy also loves to help others, and to be a good friend. She is described as someone who "always goes that extra mile to see how you are doing and is genuinely interested in your life."

According to Missy's SSA, she regularly reports how much she enjoys her life. We at Murray Ridge are very happy for her!
