Ohio Library for the Blind & Physically Disabled

Provided by the Cleveland Public Library, The Ohio Library for the Blind and Physically Disabled (OLBPD) is available to any Ohio resident or Ohioan living abroad who is unable to read or use standard print materials as a result of a temporary or permanent visual, physical or neurological limitation. Braille and audio materials are circulated to eligible borrowers in the State of Ohio by postage-free mail. Interested parties may request an application from the OLBPD, the

State Library of Ohio, as well as most public libraries. Applications are also available at the OLBPD website at http://olbpd.cpl.org.



Communication Disability Law

According to a recent article in the Mansfield *News Journal*, Ohio drivers or passengers who suffer from diagnosed communication disabilities now have an extra layer of protection during traffic stops. Since August, 2018, Ohio has a **'Communication Disability Law,'** which allows individuals diagnosed with certain communication disabilities to have that condition registered with the Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles. This law covers people on the autism spectrum, those who can't hear well, and those who become easily confused or have other disabilities that alter their interactions with other humans. Officers making traffic stops are immediately notified through a database if an affiliated vehicle is pulled over.

Q & A Corner

As the system for serving people with developmental disabilities evolves, those eligible for services and their family members may have many questions. Below are answers to a couple of questions that have arisen.

Q. What are 'participant-directed' supports?

A. Participant-directed supports are available through the Medicaid waivers that are administered by county boards of developmental disabilities; these waivers include the Individual Options Waiver, the Level I Waiver, and the SELF Waiver. (There is a waiting list for these waivers.)

There are two types of 'participant-directed' supports:

<u>Participant-Directed Goods and Services (PDGS)</u> is a support category that is only available through the SELF Waiver. Providers of PDGS (which may include services, equipment, supplies, etc. that are not available through the Medicaid State Plan and are not covered under another SELF Waiver support category) do not need certification from Medicaid or the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities (DODD). Every county board of developmental disabilities must approve or deny requested PDGS based upon the DODD rule and uniform quidelines, including the requirement that PDGS "are a medical necessity supported by the results of the person's assessment."

<u>Participant-Directed Homemaker Personal Care (PDHPC)</u> is a support category that is available through the Individual Options Waiver, the Level I Waiver, and the SELF Waiver. Providers of PDHPC (which may include assistance with daily living, decision making, accessing community, accessing medical/health care services, etc.) <u>do</u> need certification from Medicaid and the DODD; however, for PDHPC providers, waiver recipients may choose to negotiate rates other than the standard 'rule rates' for Homemaker Personal Care, and for Independent Providers of PDHPC may waive certain DODD certification requirements.

Q. With regard to 'participant-directed' supports, what is the role of the state-appointed financial management agency?

A. <u>Morning Sun</u> is the financial management agency that has been designated by DODD to process PDGS and employ Independent providers of PDHPC.

All PDGS are paid for through Morning Sun. Morning Sun also orders the equipment and supplies, and sends the items to SELF Waiver recipients.

Independent Providers of PDHPC must submit employment applications (completed together with the waiver recipients they will serve) to and be hired by Morning Sun; the county board must confirm that a PDHPC Independent Provider has been hired by Morning Sun before adding the services to be delivered by the provider to the ISP. The provider/Morning Sun employee must submit service documentation and timesheets signed by the waiver recipient/designee to Morning Sun in order to receive payment for services.

For more information on requirements related to self-directed support, see Ohio Administrative Code sections 5123-9-32 and 5123-9-45.



If you are a Lorain County resident with developmental disabilities or a family member/advocate of an eligible individual and have unanswered questions, we would like to have the opportunity to address your concerns in person. In the month of July, Superintendent Fisher has set aside 7/11 and 7/25 for individual meetings with LCBDD-eligible individuals and/or their family members; appointments will be available from 9:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., and from 4:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. on those dates. BOARD ROOM BRIEFING

The Lorain County Board of DD convened at 6:30 p.m. on June 24, 2019:

Murray Ridge Program Specialist Jim Nagy (retired wrestler 'Mad Dog Manson') and his son Andrew presented a check for the Friends of Murray Ridge in the amount of \$1,610, proceeds from Breaking Down Barriers IX which was held on May 4, 2019; Breaking Down Barriers, an annual family-friendly wrestling event put on by Mega Championship Wrestling (MCW) for the benefit of Lorain County residents with developmental disabilities, was initiated more than nine years ago and, in addition to providing much appreciated financial support to the Friends of Murray Ridge, is eagerly awaited and attended by many members of the Murray Ridge family each year. Board member Dan White announced that the Board Award Committee had selected a nominated Murray Ridge employee to receive the next quarterly Exceptional Service Award. The Board unanimously passed revisions to the policy on Federally Funded Grants, as well as four new policies related to procurement and management of federally funded grants. The Board also unanimously approved the initiation of Medicaid waiver enrollments that were originally planned for CY 2020, immediately upon completion of the required/standardized assessments of every individual who was on the county's waiver waiting list prior to the (09/01/2018) effective date of the current waiting list rule; at this time, it is anticipated that these assessments will be completed by 09/01/2019, four months ahead of schedule.
