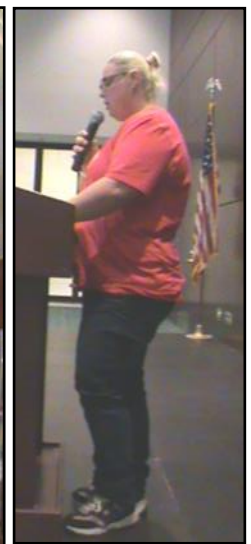


'Find Your Voice' Self-Advocacy Event

This event featured guest speakers, **Josh Anderson** from No Regretz, and **Britta Hough** from the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities, as well as Lorain County consumers, **Megan Beals**, **Matthew Schoerverth**, **Dan Fenik**, and **Diana Clement**.

Josh Anderson inspired the audience members to set goals for themselves, be persistent, and live with no regrets. Britta Hough discussed options for finding your own unique path to community employment. The four Lorain County consumers shared their experiences with self-advocacy as well as their successes, dreams, and hopes for the future.

Ashley lives in North Ridgeville with her father, Larry, and her dog, Midnight. She is the youngest of six siblings with four older sisters and one older brother. Ashley is a kind, funny and helpful individual who is very independent. She is able to handle her finances and most of her medical and income benefits (Dad is always available when needed).



Ashley loves to help her father plan and prepare their meals and go grocery shopping. She also enjoys going bowling with him. At home she plays with her dog and watches TV. **Ashley is supported by her Murray Ridge Center Service and Support Administrator, Deanne King. Deanne assists Ashley with the development of her Individual Service Plan, monitors her services, and helps to keep her plan up to date as her needs and desires change.**



In June, 2018, Deanne coordinated the installation of a vertical platform lift at Ashley's front door to enable her to enter and exit the home safely and independently.

Ashley is supported in the community by Deloris Kibble, Independent Provider, who is also a retiree from the Murray Ridge Center-Elyria Opportunity/Vocational Center. Deloris helps Ashley to access the many activities that she enjoys in the community by providing companionship and transportation. When out and about with Deloris, she likes to go shopping at the thrift stores, go out to eat, go to see scary movies, and go to the library. She also really likes attending the Mega Championship Wrestling event "Breaking Down Barriers."



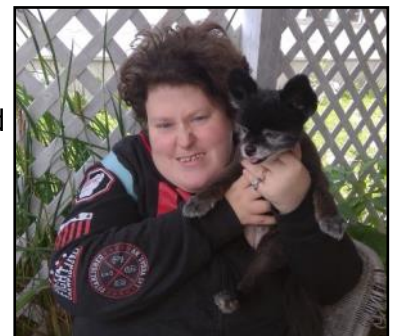
During the week, Ashley attends a day program operated by Rising Sun Centers. Rising Sun is a small program (for a maximum of 60 individuals) that opened in 2011. Rising Sun offers volunteer opportunities, recreational activities, func-



tional academics, daily exercise programs, arts and crafts, opportunities for paid work and gardening (in a vegetable garden during the summer). Ashley has attended Rising Sun Center since 2015 and has made many friends there. Ashley said she loves being able to help her peers and work in groups. She also enjoys the various volunteer opportunities such as those at the nursing home, Salvation Army, Neighborhood Alliance Daycare Center and Habitat for Humanity. Her favorite thing to do is taking part in the

Cooking Club! Each person cooks something at home and brings it in for everyone in the club to share and experience different styles of food. She looks forward to every other Friday when a therapy dog comes to visit at Rising Sun.

In 2018 Ashley expressed interest in finding a job in the community. **Though the Opportunities for Ohioans with Disabilities (OOD) process, Ashley chose Goodwill Industries for Supported Employment services.** With the support of Goodwill, Ashley completed Job Seeking Skills Training, and received help with resume development, job searching (on-line and in the community), interviewing skills and networking. With the help from Goodwill, she was able to find and secure a job at Horizon Daycare in Westlake as a classroom aide assisting the teachers with caring for the children. Unfortunately, the daycare downsized and Ashley was laid off. She was then able to find a job at Walmart as a stock person, but it turned out to not be a good fit. Nonetheless, Ashley has not lost determination in her job search, and she continues to work with her job developer at Goodwill. Ashley is very excited about the future and all of the new opportunities opening up for her.

BOARD ROOM BRIEFING

The Lorain County Board of DD convened at 6:30 p.m. on August 26, 2019

In order to reflect changes to the Ohio Administrative Code, the Board unanimously approved revisions to the following policies: *Resolution of Complaints Involving the Lorain County Board of Developmental Disabilities and Appeals of Adverse Action Proposed or Initiated by the Lorain County Board of Developmental Disabilities*, and *Waiting Lists*. In order to enable part-time Management and Confidential employees to convert a portion of earned sick time to vacation time, in keeping with a recent change to the Collective Bargaining Agreement, the Board unanimously approved revisions to the following policies: *Sick Leave* and *Vacation Leave*. Jeff Miller, Director of Vocational and Transportation Services, presented and the Board unanimously approved Murray Ridge School bus stops for the 2019-2020 school year, and Superintendent Fisher/her designee(s) were authorized to relocate or designate additional bus stops during the school year, as needed. The Board unanimously established the dollar amount that the Family Support Parent Committee is authorized to approve for the fourth quarter of 2019.

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Murray Ridge to Operate a Point of Distribution in the Case of Certain Emergencies

In the event of a county-wide health emergency requiring the distribution of medicine or treatment, Murray Ridge Center, in conjunction with Lorain County Public Health, will operate a temporary Point of Distribution (POD) to provide medicine or treatments to consumers (people with developmental disabilities who have been determined eligible for services from the Lorain County Board of Developmental Disabilities), and their immediate caregivers.

Family members who live in households with children and adults with developmental disabilities will be eligible to receive medication/treatment from the Murray Ridge Center closed POD. Caregivers assigned at the time of POD operation to work with individuals with developmental disabilities who do not live with family will also be eligible to receive medicine/treatment from the Murray Ridge Center POD for themselves and members of their immediate households.

Should the need to operate a Murray Ridge Center POD occur, specifics will be communicated on the Murray Ridge Center Facebook page, on our website, and/or through other local media and other communications.
