



Valerie has been with Murray Ridge since 1993, and her numerous roles at Murray Ridge include: Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor, Preschool Teacher, Early Intervention Specialist, Early Intervention Supervisor, and Investigative Agent (IA). Her knowledge of our agency and the IA role will undoubtedly be a great asset to us as Valerie begins her new role.



What is an Investigative Agent?

Murray Ridge employs four Investigative Agents, also known as IAs, whose purpose is to investigate and prevent incidents that adversely affect the health and welfare of local citizens with developmental disabilities. Our IAs investigate allegations of abuse, neglect, and other offenses against people with developmental disabilities, and assist with prevention planning by looking

closely at factors contributing to both individual incidents and to any identified trends and patterns. IAs also train all staff at Murray Ridge and others who serve eligible individuals on identifying and reporting rights violations and other incidents that adversely impact Lorain County residents with developmental disabilities.




30 Year Old Murray Ridge Center Time Capsule
