



Commencement 2011

On June 3, 2011, nine students took their first steps toward adulthood.

Murray Ridge School Commencement 2011 began with an original composition written specifically for graduation by Nevan Eilbeck, music teacher at the school, titled "Just By Being You," and beautifully sung by staff member Kathy Beatty. A welcome by **Director of Education Dann** Swift followed by a soulful rendition of "The Greatest Love of All" by the Murray Ridge Choraleers then set the tone for the rest of the event.

Superintendent Fisher spoke of how much the students have already accomplished, and what they can accomplish as they make the transition into adulthood.

"They have the opportunity to contribute in accordance with their own unique abilities and aspirations," Dr. Fisher remarked. She thanked the assembled teachers and therapists for helping the seniors along the path to graduation, and called upon the Adult Program staff, Service and Support Administrators, and current caregivers to help transition the students to the working world. She then went on to quote Mattie Stepanek, a child poet and peace activist who fought a debilitating illness. "Every day we must have confidence in what we are doing. Trying new things is important. And if we believe in ourselves and have confidence, we can achieve so many exciting goals."

Ohio's 57th District State Representative Matt Lundy, the ceremony's keynote speaker, delivered an inspirational speech, stopping to thank the students, staff, families, and caregivers for all they've done to help guide these graduates. Addressing the seniors, Rep. Lundy said, "Your daily attempts to reach your goals made today a reality."

Rep. Lundy also remarked on the incredible things Murray Ridge School has done for consumers and the community, saying "This facility is made possible through the support from Lorain County residents, and I thank you."

Director of Vocational and Transportation Services Jeff Miller added his own encouraging words to each senior, "Welcome to the adult world. You will make new friends and new memories as the next chapter of your lives begin."

Following the keynote address, Board President Michelle Hunt and Rep. Lundy presented each graduate with a diploma and a certificate from the Ohio House of Representatives. Finally, the tenth annual David Elasser Spirit Award was presented to Juan Pino by Kathy Oblak, mother of David Elsasser, a student at Murray Ridge School who passed away 10 years ago.

The ceremony concluded with Dann Swift wishing the seniors best of luck in the future, and thanking them for their hard work and dedication as students at Murray Ridge School.

BOARD ROOM BRIEFING

Board member Dr. Jane Spiegelberg presented the Lorain County Board of Developmental Disabilities Exceptional Service Award to music teacher Nevan Eilbeck (affectionately known as "Mr. E" by Murray Ridge School students). In special recognition of his achievement, Director of Educational Services, Dann Swift shared how the entire school frequently utilizes original compositions by Mr. Eilbeck that emphasize health and safety matters. The presentation concluded with two students performing two songs. In other business, the Board unanimously approved revisions to policies concerning Retention of Board Records, Establishing Staff Ratios for Early Intervention, and Admission Criteria For Residential, Children's Services and Adult Services. Additionally, the Board unanimously approved a Transition Agreement for Help Me Grow - Part "C" to Part "B." Superintendent Fisher also announced the resignation of Dr. Spiegelberg from the Board, explaining that she would soon be relocating to another state. Superintendent Fisher thanked Dr. Spiegelberg for her service to the Board, particularly as chair of the staff recognition committee.

Harold West Home Dedication



On Sunday, May 15th, Murray Ridge Housing Corporation (MRHC) celebrated the dedication of its a newly constructed, fully accessible home for individuals with developmental disabilities in honor of Attorney Harold West, who served as a member of the MRHC Board for more than sixteen years. An attractive plaque commemorating Mr. West's years of service has been mounted next to the front door of the home. Members of Mr. West's family were on-hand for the celebration, along with the individuals living in the home, their provider staff from Flat Rock Community Services,

friends, neighbors, and family members. Approximately 90% of the cost of constructing this new home was covered by capital grant funds available from the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities. In addition to generous living space for the three residents, the home provides a small separate suite that is currently leased to LCBDD and is designed to provide temporary emergency housing.

Exceptional Service Award Presented to Nevan Eilbeck

Twenty-five years ago, West Point Band member and trumpeter Nevan Eilbeck heard about a job teaching music at Murray Ridge School. While new to teaching, Nevan soon discovered his own unique way of reaching students through music. Rather than simply play instruments or sing songs, he composes individualized lyrics for each student. Nevan's compositions, which set the students'



names and personal goals to music, seem to reach the children in ways that mere language sometimes cannot.

This past December, Nevan hosted a group of Oberlin College students who spent time observing his unique teaching style. Students were so moved by his approach that one of the attending music professors, Dr. Peggy Bennett, nominated Nevan for an Exceptional Service Award.
