## Oberlin Consumer Raises Money for the American Cancer Society

John Bennington knows what it's like to be charitable.

After 22 years with Murray Ridge working in the Lorain and Oberlin Work/Activity Centers, John has seen his fair share of people helping others. He has watched staff and consumers work together towards making someone's life a little easier, a little more comfortable, and oftentimes, a lot better.

Recently John overheard a staff member from his Echoing Lakes residential home discussing his

sister's battle with a cancerous brain tumor. Moved by her struggle, John decided it was time to take action and help fund a cure for all cancers, for all people, through the American Cancer society.

The American Cancer Society (ACS) is the largest voluntary health organization in the United States. Since 1946, ACS has spent more than \$3.5 billion on cancer research, and hundreds of millions of dollars trying to fight cancer on a global scale. Nearly all of the funds used by ACS are from private donations or fundraising.

John has been raising funds by placing a collection can at the entrance to the Oberlin Work/Activity Center. He plans to add additional cans to the Lorain and Elyria locations in hopes of raising more than \$300 through "John's Jugs." John is confident that, with his help and the charity of our Murray Ridge consumers, staff, and visitors, we can help find a cure for cancer.

Kathy Walcott, a Qualified Mental Retardation Professionals (QMRP) who has worked with John for the past five years in his residential home, feels this effort not only benefits ACS, but John as well. "I think it's really good for him to have an outlet for his feelings, to do something positive," she said.

John hopes that his contribution will do what he has seen done so often over the years – help someone in need.

"He's very empathetic," Kathy remarked. "Things affect him. This type of fundraising is something that is very encouraging. It shows how much he cares."

The highlight of the Beach Bash was the "Toss at the Boss" water balloon fight, where consumers were encouraged to soak Work-


tables, beach games, and a surf board decorating contest!
