

In honor of Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month, Murray Ridge School teacher Cheryl Swierz decided to teach her students a very valuable lesson; people with developmental disabilities can contribute to the workforce in unique and meaningful ways. She accomplished this through a field trip on March 2 to the Two Café and Boutique, a restaurant and store that trains and employs individuals with developmental disabilities.

The Two Café and Boutique, located in Chagrin Falls, is a premier training and employment center for the Two Foundation, a unique staffing agency seeking to enhance workplaces by employing individuals with mild to moderate developmental disabilities. The store strives to bring the two worlds of education and business opportunities together to give employees with developmental disabilities the preparation they need to be successful in the local work force. The individuals receive real life work experience in a fully integrated setting.

Teacher Cheryl Swierz confirmed the positive experiences her students received from the trip. "They got to witness other individuals with disabilities working in the community," she said. "They were able to talk with the employees about what they liked about their jobs."



BOARD ROOM BRIEFING

The Lorain County Board of DD convened at 12:30 p.m. on April 1, 2016:

Board Member Dan White announced that the Exceptional Service Board Award committee had selected a recipient for the award to be presented at the April meeting. The Board approved a resolution to adopt the Strategic Plan Progress Report/Annual Action Plan: Programs & Expenditures - 2016. Superintendent Fisher explained anticipated revenues and variable expenses of the Agency's preschool program for the 2016/2017 school year. The Board voted unanimously to retain the current rate structure for both school districts and parents of typically developing peers that place students in the Murray Ridge Preschool program for the 2016/2017 school year. The Board unanimously established the dollar amount that the Family Support Parent Committee is authorized to approve in the second quarter of 2016. Superintendent Fisher discussed the transfer of Academy Court home bed licenses.
