

### Murray Ridge Center Continues its Volunteer Work by Participating in State-Wide "Always There" Week of Service

2017 marks the 50th anniversary of Murray Ridge Center, as county boards of developmental disabilities were created by the Ohio Legislature in 1967 with the passage of Senate Bill 169. To celebrate this milestone, Murray Ridge has been busy working on its 50 Acts of Giving Back, a 50-year anniversary initiative whereby, in 2017, members of the Murray Ridge family will 'give back' through at least fifty acts of helping to meet needs in Lorain County. This initiative will run until the end of 2017, and, within the first seven months, our Adult Program participants have already completed 137 Acts by 126 different individuals!

In addition to this exciting and successful project, Murray Ridge Center participated in the Ohio Association of County Boards of Developmental Disabilities' (OACB's) "Always There" Week of Service. During this Week of Service, which took place July 17-21, Murray Ridge joined with other Ohio county boards in celebrating their shared heritage, accomplishments, and community support. The campaign was sponsored by the OACB, a nonprofit organization specializing in providing

Other Murray Ridge volunteers cleaned items and stocked shelves at Habitat for Humanity Restore and Vermilion Evangelical and Reform Church's Kids Boutique.

To make sure you and your child are ready to get the Murray Ridge School year off to a great start, please read the following information, which includes important dates and helpful reminders;

- The school-wide "Meet the Teacher/Open House" is scheduled for Monday, August 28 from 5:30 PM to 6:30 PM
- First day of school is Tuesday, August 29
- Preschoolers start September 5

Parents should make sure that all school forms for their children have been filled out and submitted. If not, please mail them, or bring them to the school as soon as possible. Contact the school if you need to have a packet mailed to you.

We will be participating in the National Free/Reduced Lunch program. Free/Reduced Lunch applications will go home the first week of school. However, you may purchase a lunch for your child before the application is processed. The cost for breakfast is \$1.41, and the cost for lunch is \$2.71

It's August and that means it is time to take those last-minute vacations and to get your children ready for returning to school. Here are a few simple safety tips to help make back-to-school less stressful for everyone involved:

- Keep backpacks light for safety: It is easy to over load a backpack with books, lunches, supplies and so forth. Keep in mind that a backpack should not be heavier than 10-20% of a child's body weight.
- Supply sunscreen: Don't forget to send sunscreen to school so it can be applied for those outside activities while the weather is still nice. This is especially important if your child is sensitive to the standard sunscreen with PABA and needs a PABA-free product
- Make sure kids get rest: Kids will do better in school if they have plenty of rest. Now is the time to start back in with set bedtime habits to encourage adequate sleep and rest.

#### Eye On Health

- Communicate with the nursing staff: Keeping the school nurses aware of what is going on with a child will ensure continuity of care and will allow closer monitoring of health related conditions. Be sure to let the nurses know of any changes in medications, allergies and/or treatments; and to let the nurses know if there are any issues happening at home that may impact the health of the child or classmates (bed bugs, lice, fleas, flu and so forth). The nurses will work collaboratively with parents to get through almost any health related problem.

MRHC is a non-profit housing board, providing financing, acquisition, and management of housing in Lorain County for individuals with developmental disabilities since 1992. MRHC was initiated by the Lorain County Board of Developmental Disabilities, or Murray Ridge Center, as it is more commonly known. Since its inception, MRHC has been committed to the goal of ensuring the availability of community-based living arrangements for eligible Lorain County citizens with developmental disabilities. Collectively, the homes owned by MRHC provide safe and affordable housing for more than 110 individuals with developmental disabilities. All 31 homes are located in traditional residential neighborhoods throughout Lorain County.

For more than 10 years, Oberlin College has been sending students from the Credo Program to perform for the adult




