DODD Announces Public Meetings in December on Ohio's Medicaid Waiver Transition Plan

As explained in Superintendent Fisher's article in the September edition of the Courier, the federal Medicaid agency (CMS) will be requiring that waiver recipients (like people enrolled on the IO and Level 1 Waivers) have the opportunity to receive services in more 'community-based' settings.

The Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities (DODD) has scheduled a series of public meetings in December designed to educate the public on the state's current efforts to achieve compliance with new federal Medicaid rules. Also discussed will be the state's draft transition plan that will be submitted to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) in the coming weeks.

These meetings are the first such public education events hosted by the Department about the transition plan itself. These are meant to be informational only and are not for the purpose of receiving official public comment on the state's proposed transition plan.

The Department has indicated the Governor's Office of Health Transformation (OHT) will be coordinating the official comment process, and forum attendees will receive instruction on how to submit public comment during the meetings. OACB will also share this information with members as soon as it becomes available.

The Crew at Murray Ridge School held its annual induction ceremony on November 19.

The Crew is a pre-vocational work program for soon-to-be transitioning students at Murray Ridge School. It was developed as a way to provide real world work experience, and takes students through each phase of the process: completing an application, preparing for an official interview, being offered and accepting a job, job training, performing the job, and completing responsibilities in order to maintain good work status.



Teacher Nick Kish developed this program five years ago to help Murray Ridge School staff provide students with a sense of responsibility and pride in their work, resulting in increased self esteem, social appropriateness, being part of a team, and an opportunity to give back to their school community.

"It is a total team effort to best prepare our students for life after graduation," Kish said. "The students gain the necessary skills to be contributing members of our community."

This year, 70 students were inducted at the Crew Ceremony; 32 jobs were available, including 8 communitybased enclaves. Other teachers and staff are very much involved in helping to train the students to do their jobs, be on time, and assist them in any way they need.

"This program is probably the most complete vocational training program in any school around," said Director of Education Dann Swift. "It's on the cutting edge of Employment inititive4."

Parents and caregivers of school students should disregard the "Murray Ridge—Adult Activities Centers" listing, and follow only the listing for "Murray Ridge School." Conversely, adult consumers who attend our Opportunity/Vocational Centers and their parents/caregivers should disregard the "Murray Ridge School" listing, and follow only the listing for "Murray Ridge—Adult Activities Centers."

If "Open—No Transportation" follows the announcement for "Murray Ridge—Adult Activities Centers," parents/ caregivers are welcome to transport adult consumers to their day service sites. Regular programming will be provided. Consumers should be dropped off no earlier than 8:30 a.m. and <u>must</u> be picked up by 3:45 p.m.

In the event of bad weather, the decision to transport individuals to Murray Ridge Center will be based on the ability of our buses to travel safely on city and county roads. Regardless of whether or not transportation is available through Murray Ridge Center, if our Opportunity/Vocational Centers are open, but there is an individual concern about the weather, adult consumers should feel free to stay home. Likewise, parents/caregivers of Murray Ridge School students who have individual concerns regarding the weather should feel free to keep their child at home.

Please be aware that transportation to enclave sites is generally available even if transportation to the Opportunity/ Vocational Centers is cancelled. Murray Ridge Center does not broadcast the status of enclave transportation on the television or radio. Consumers should assume that enclave transportation will be available unless they receive a phone call from a member of our Community Employment program.

The Lorain County Board of DD convened at 12:30 p.m. on November 21, 2014:

Superintendent Amber Fisher provided an update on Murray Ridge Special Olympics programs and the Community Education and Supported Employment Marketing campaigns. Superintendent Fisher also updated the Board on developments related to the new CMS rule. The 2015 budget was approved, as submitted. Twenty-four additional Medicaid Waiver Enrollments were discussed and approved. In other news, Board President Michelle Hunt was chosen as the Agency delegate to the upcoming Ohio Association of County Boards (OACB) delegate assembly. The Murray Ridge Support Group announced a donation of 40 \$100 gift certificates that will be handed out to families in need this holiday season.
