Science Fair Fun at Murray Ridge School!

Murray Ridge School has been working very hard this year on teaching and implementing Ohio's Learning Standards Extended; standards which help to ensure that students with significant cognitive disabilities are provided with multiple ways to learn and demonstrate knowledge.

The School's Intermediate team of teachers Cheryl Swierz, Vickie Nagy, and Julie Maurer helped to plan a school wide Science Fair held on November 30. Each class researched and chose an appropriate science experiment for its class, and was asked to document the experiment on a tri-fold with pictures, explanations, and results. Classes learned about the Scientific Method, performed the experiments together, and documented results. At the Science Fair, the students were then able to explain, recreate, and back up the results of their experiments.

Each student at Murray Ridge School has a unique way of dealing with the challenges that he or she faces, and each has a unique way of learning. This Science Fair was a way to highlight each students' talents and abilities. The teachers were able to tap into the students' individual learning strengths, which made it easier to make the science fair projects accessible to each student. The Science Fair had nonverbal students with Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) devices giving explanations or demonstrating how to perform the actual experiment; and verbal students answered questions from guests, other staff, and students, and provided explanations of the results of the experiments.

"It truly was a group effort and priceless to see their faces as they shared their work with excitement or explored others experiments," said Classroom Supervisor Stacie Starr. "We want everyone to know that our students are capable of creating and performing science fair projects if they are given the right tools, guidance, and support. The hands-on learning and repetition is extremely important to their development and retention of materials taught."

- Murray Ridge School

Parents and caregivers of school students should disregard the "Murray Ridge—Adult Activities Centers" listing, and follow only the listing for "Murray Ridge School." Conversely, adult consumers who attend our Opportunity/ Vocational Centers and their parents/caregivers should disregard the "Murray Ridge School" listing, and follow only the listing for "Murray Ridge—Adult Activities Centers."

If "Open—No Transportation" follows the announcement for "Murray Ridge—Adult Activities Centers," parents/caregivers are welcome to transport adult consumers to their day service sites. Regular programming will be provided. Consumers should be dropped off no earlier than 8:30 a.m. and must be picked up by 3:45 p.m.

In the event of bad weather, the decision to transport individuals to Murray Ridge Center will be based on the ability of our buses to travel safely on city and county roads. Regardless of whether or not transportation is available through Murray Ridge Center, if our Opportunity/Vocational Centers are open, but there is an individual concern about the weather, adult consumers should feel free to stay home. Likewise, parents/caregivers of Murray Ridge School students who have individual concerns regarding the weather should feel free to keep their child at home, even if school is in session.

Please be aware that transportation to enclave sites is generally available even if transportation to the Opportunity/Vocational Centers is cancelled. Murray Ridge Center does not broadcast the status of enclave transportation on the television or radio. Consumers should assume that enclave transportation will be available unless they receive a phone call from a member of our Supported Employment Department.



BOARD ROOM BRIEFING

The Lorain County Board of DD convened at 12:30 p.m. on November 28, 2016:

Jerry Ivancic, owner of Strongsville Hobby and member of Super Heroes to Kids in Ohio, presented the Board with the final donations from an Epi-Pen fundraiser for Murray Ridge School that was sponsored by many local organizations. Board Member Henry Patterson provided an update on the recent Public Relations Committee meeting. Board member Vassie Scott provided an update on the recent Special Olympics Committee meeting; it was noted that this program yields a big 'happiness return' on each \$ spent on it. The Board examined fiscal projections for the next several years; Superintendent Fisher and Board members discussed the forecast and its implications. The 2017 budget was approved unanimously. The Board also passed a resolution requesting that the Lorain County Auditor certify availability of Lorain County Board of DD (LCBDD) funds required to pay the non-federal share for Medicaid waiver services in 2017. The Board unanimously established the dollar amount that the Family Support Parent Committee is authorized to approve in the first quarter of 2017. Director of Business John Bonko discussed a proposed policy entitled Federally Funded Grants, and it was passed unanimously by the Board. The Board appointed Amber Fisher to act as its representative, and SSA Director Heather Gurchik to act as representative in Superintendent Fisher's absence, with regard to its business with the NEON Council of Governments. Dr. Fisher presented John Bonko, who will be leaving the agency in December to become the Business Director for the Geauga County Board of DD, with a plague commemorating his more than 25 years of service with LCBDD.
