Warm Hats, Warm Hearts Continues the Season of Giving

Come January, many feel the "season of giving" has disappeared with the leftover fruit cake and crumpled wrapping paper. Now that the holidays have passed, our willingness to give to those who are in need may be beginning to wane.

At Murray Ridge Center, however, the desire to give remains strong, as demonstrated by our talented consumers with the Elyria Opportunity/Vocational Center's Warm Hats, Warm Hearts Club.

You may remember last April when an article appeared in this newsletter describing the charitable deeds of the newly created Warm Hats, Warm Hearts Club - the brainchild of Penni Schuster and Josh Rosecrans, two staff members at the Elyria Opportunity/Vocational Center. In January 2012, when weaving looms and yarn were donated to Murray Ridge, Penni gathered twelve consumers interested in the craft of weaving and put them to work, teaching them how to use the looms and yarn to create warm winter hats. The goal of the project was to donate the hats and scarves the following winter.

The group got busy and, in the year that followed, the women have knitted more than 50 hats and scarves for adults, and more than 20 hats for the children.

The decision on where to donate was easy for the group: keep it local and donate to a good cause, one that the consumers felt inspired to support. Catholic Charities and Blessing House, both of Lorain, were the first-place winners.

The Lorain Family Center of Cleveland Catholic Charities, known in the neighborhood as "8th Street," offers services to help individuals and families meet their immediate basic needs. Services provided include hot meals, choice pantry, clothing/ furniture referral assistance, prescription and utility assistance, and GED instruction. It also serves as a day shelter for persons who are homeless or otherwise vulnerable.

Blessing House serves as a safety net for children of families in crisis by providing a temporary safe home for children and support for their families. Its children's crisis care center is open 24 hours a day, every day of the year, and is always ready to help families during their times of need.

On January 29, both organizations welcomed The Murray

Ridge Center Warm Hats, Warm Hearts Club with open arms and an eagerness to learn more about who we serve in Lorain County. They found inspiration in the time and patience it took the consumers to create their knitted masterpieces, and were equally impressed with Murray Ridge's desire to pass those creations along to those in need.

Catholic Charities' Program Director Lynn Wrice-Head was overwhelmed by the women who visited with her to make the donation. After remarking on their handiwork, she noted, "This is extremely helpful. We are totally dependent on donations, and hats and gloves are very much needed, especially during these hard winter months."

The Blessing House was equally thrilled with Warm Hats, Warm Hearts. Sr. Mary Berigan, Co-founder and Director of Blessing House, has a special place in her heart for Murray Ridge; the very first child served at Blessing House was from Murray Ridge Center, and that child's handprint can still be found in the hall of the house. Sr. Mary also brings her therapy dog, Moses, to Murray Ridge School for student interaction and therapy. With this recent donaton, she found even more reason to support Murray Ridge. "The kids love the hats and scarves! These aren't the ones you can find in the store! They love knowing these were handmade, just for them, by someone in the community, and that their hat or scarf is truly one of a kind."

But it wasn't just the donation recipients who were touched by the selflessness of Murray Ridge consumers. Club director and Murray Ridge staff member Penni Schuster found this circle of giving to be an excellent example of basic human kindness. "I feel this project is a lesson in paying it forward," she said. "The consumers really have taken it to the next level by thinking of places they can donate the hats and blankets."

And the goodwill has prompted increased self-esteem among the Warm Hats, Warm Hearts Club. Tiffany, one club member, commented "It makes me feel good knowing the hats I make keep people warm."

"It makes me feel happy knowing the items are going to people who really need them," remarked another club member Latasha. "It makes me feel very fortunate."

This remarkable club has shown the staff at Murray Ridge Center, other attendees of our adult day programs, as well as citizens of Lorain County that despite a disability, the *ability* of our program participants to give to those in need has created a lasting impression that will be enjoyed by

many for years to come.







Exceptional Service at Murray Ridge Center

On Friday, January 25, the Lorain County Board of Developmental Disabilities awarded it quarterly Exceptional Service Award to Lorain Opportunity/ Vocational Center employee, Gloria Henline.

Gloria has been working at MRC for 19 years. She provides vocational skills training to individuals with a wide range of abilities. Gloria provides side-by-side training, makes visual models, and solicits the creation of mechanical jigs and fixtures to help consumers with significant limitations perform vocational tasks.

In a nomination letter submitted by the parent of a consumer, Gloria was described as someone who understands how to work with all people, particularly those on the autism spectrum and others with challenging behaviors. Gloria's supervisor, Terri Camp, describes her as patient and kind, and one who can help individuals form appropriate and positive relationships with others.

In accepting her award, Gloria thanked the LCBDD for the honor, and ended her short speech by saying "I'm just doing my job...and I love my job."

BOARD ROOM BRIEFING

The Lorain County Board of DD convened at 12:30 p.m. on January 25:

At the **Organizational Meeting**, the Board re-elected Michelle L. Hunt, President, Kurt Koepf, Vice President, and Bob Gajdos, Secretary. President Hunt then made all Board-committee appointments.

At the **Regular Meeting**, Gloria Henline was awarded the Exceptional Service Award for her work with adult consumers at the Lorain Opportunity/Vocational Center. In other business, the Board approved the annual resolution to provide educational services to children ages 6 through 21 at Murray Ridge School. Dann Swift, Director of Education, updated the Board on options for the Murray Ridge School summer camp 2013; formal requests for funds will be submitted to the Board in March. The Board unanimously approved a draft of the 2013 Annual Action Plan/Programs and Expenditures for public review, and gave a 30-day notice of a public forum on the document, which is scheduled for 12 p.m. on February 25 at the Administration Building, 1091 Infirmary Road, Elyria. The document will be available for inspection at all Opportunity/ Vocational Centers, Murray Ridge School, the Service and Support Administration Building, the Administration Building, and at each of the six residential facilities of the Board. The Funding/Forecasting/Medicaid Services Manager, Nikki Dye, updated the Board on 2012 expenditures, which had been adjusted to reflect the actual vs. anticipated figures. Dr. Fisher updated the Board on developments including the scheduled return of individuals currently attending Creative Learning Workshop to Murray Ridge Adult Services, and a decrease in the federal contribution to the cost of Medicaid Services. Superintendent Fisher then requested approval for a new policy, *Early Intervention Referral to Help Me Grow (HMG) Program*; the Board unanimously approved the policy. The March Board meeting was moved to March 22.
