A New Spin on Charitable Giving for 2007

Individuals and businesses making contributions to charity should keep in mind some new and important tax law changes in 2007. We appreciate that many of our readers may make monetary donations to Murray Ridge Center or to other organizations in need. You might find helpful the following new guidelines, as established by the Internal Revenue Service:

- In order to deduct charitable monetary donations, taxpayers must either have a bank record, such as a canceled check, bank, credit union, or credit card statement, or the individual may submit written verification from the organization, including the charity name, and the date and amount of the contribution
- Donations of money include those made in cash or by check, electronic funds transfer, credit card, and payroll deduction

Make a commitment to be more physically active. Aim for 30 minutes of moderate-intensity activity on most, preferably all, days of the week.

Choose a diet low in saturated fat, trans fat, and cholesterol, and moderate in total fat.

• Know your numbers

Ask your doctor to check your blood pressure, cholesterol, and blood glucose levels. Work with your physician to improve any numbers that are not within normal ranges.

Triumph Through the Challenges of Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder

The Lorain County General Health District is once again offering *Tri-umph Through the Challenges of Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder*, a four-week course for parents, grandparents, guardians, caregivers, and those who work with children who may have had prenatal exposure to alcohol or drugs. By attending this 12-hour series, you can learn more about what fetal alcohol spectrum disorder is, and how you can help your child succeed. The course will be held on March 6, 12, 20, and 27, with two class times to choose from at 9:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m., or 6:00-9:30 p.m. There is no cost to attend the series. Workbooks will be available for loan or to purchase for \$15. Continuing Education Credits (12 hours) are available to foster caregivers, social workers, counselors, BRCH, MR/DD, and certificates of attendance will be given.





The Lorain County Board of MR/DD convened at 7:30 p.m. on January 31.

At the **Organizational Meeting**, the Board elected to retain its present slate of officers for 2007. President Dan White maintained all existing Committee Assignments for 2007, and added new Board Member Michele Hunt to the Finance Committee. President White also continued the roles of Don Gehlmann as liaison to the Family Support Committee and to Murray Ridge Production Center, Inc., and Jim Uldrich, as liaison to the Murray Ridge Housing Corporation.

At the **Regular Meeting**, the Board approved the Resolution to Continue Services to Children Ages 6 through 21; approved a revised version of the Organizational Policies and Procedures Compliance Policy and voted to adopt a policy concerning the Federal Deficit Reduction Act Requirements. In other actions, the Board approved for public review the draft of the 2007 Annual Action Plan; approved the Public Forum for review of the Action Plan at 10:00 a.m. on March 5 at the Murray Ridge Administration Building, and (providing there are no changes upon public review), approved the adoption of the 2007 Action Plan with an effective date of March 6. Superintendent Fisher also updated the Board on major events in the MR/DD field, including the appointment of John Martin as the new Director of the Ohio Department of Mental Retardation & Developmental Disabilities.
