Murray Ridge Students, Adults, and Staff Celebrate the Inclusive Playground at the New Lorain County Metro Parks Facility at Hollstein Reservation in Amherst

On Wednesday, July 3rd, many gathered at the Hollstein Reservation in Amherst for the ribbon cutting ceremony and grand opening of the inclusive playground at the newest site of the Lorain County Metro Parks. The "inclusive playground," which was designed with significant input from a committee of family members of Murray Ridge service recipients, is an imaginative and state-of-the art play area where people with disabilities can play alongside typically developing peers, other family members, and the community at large. At the opening ceremony, Superintendent Fisher stated, "the Metro Parks involved Murray Ridge in this project from its inception; they worked with a committee of Murray Ridge staff and families, not only asking for our expertise and technical assistance, but also inviting the parents to *dream* about a setting that would be most

engaging for their children and adults with developmental disabilities."

And the remarkable end product *is* a dream come true for many Lorain County residents. The outdoor playground, which combines opportunities for water play, structured play and natural play in a single setting, features such attractions as a Living Willow Hut, a tree house, a stage, a sunflower

maze, a fishing pond, and a tent village. In addition to such novelties, all of which are accessible for people who use wheelchairs, the park includes more typical items such as swings, a rock pile and a covered sand pit. At the dedication event, parents Damita Vanche and Brenda Grimmett, participants on the committee that designed the playground, spoke about the true accessibility of this play area, and what it means to their families to have this resource available in Lorain County.

Located just outside the Splash Pad area of the playground is an Art Wall featuring tiles that were purchased by local citizens to support the project, and many of which were individually decorated by Murray Ridge program participants. MRC Attends 44th Annual Special Olympics Games!

Murray Ridge Center sent 48 athletes to compete in the 44th annual Special Olympics Ohio State Summer Games, a year-round training and competition program for children and adults with developmental disabilities.

The Games, which were held June 28-30 at the Ohio State University in Columbus, featured competition for Congratulations Murray Ridge athletes! more than 2,700 competitors from across the state. The program included competition in eleven sports, movies, recreational clinics, and the colorful opening ceremonies which took place at Jesse Owens Track and Field Stadium.

Murray Ridge athletes brought home many trophies, including nine gold, five silver, and three bronze medals won by the track team.

Special Olympics Ohio serves more than 17,000 citizens with intellectual disabilities. Special Olympics Ohio has an event calendar that includes seven state level championships and more than 125 local and area events in twenty-three Special Olympics type sports.

BOARD ROOM BRIEFING

The Lorain County Board of DD convened at 12:30 p.m. on June 28, 2013:

The second quarter Exceptional Service Award will be presented at the August Board Meeting. The Board unanimously established the dollar amount that the Family Support Parent Committee is authorized to approve in the third quarter of 2013. Superintendent Fisher discussed arrangements for strategic planning. Dr. Fisher announced that the agency's Help Me Grow allocation will be increased by \$105,944 for FY 2014. (Our allocation for FY 2013 had been reduced by nearly \$50,000 as compared to our FY 2012 allocation.) These monies are used to offset our cost of assessing infants and toddlers within our Early Intervention Program. The Board approved the revision of the 2013-2014 agency calendars to include December 24th as a Program Closing Day. In other business, it was reported that the Murray Ridge Support Group (MRSG) donated T-shirts for the Avon Duct Tape Parade participants. In addition, duck tape was donated by the Shurtech Brands company. The Murray Ridge Support Group will not meet again until September 5th, and September 20th will be the date of the next dance. There will be no Board meeting in July.
