MRC Attends 47th Annual Special Olympics Games!

This June, Murray Ridge Center (MRC) sent 43 athletes to the 2016 Special Olympics Ohio State Summer Games.

The Murray Ridge athletes competed in a variety of sporting events, including bocce, volleyball, tennis, track, and soccer.

The Ohio State Summer Games is a year-round training and competition program for children and adults with developmental disabilities.

The Games, which were held June 24-26 at The Ohio State University in Columbus, featured more than 2,600 competitors from 99 different local

organizations in eleven sports, and included movies and recreational clinics. Athletes and chaperones were housed in the Ohio State University dormitories and were provided six meals through the University's Student Union Services.

The weekend was kicked off with opening ceremonies on Friday evening, June 24, at Jesse Owens Track and Field Stadium. The symbolic lighting of the Olympic Flame of Hope officially opened the Games, and was followed by a dance and fair provided by hundreds of volunteers.

Murray Ridge proudly supports the Special Olympics throughout the year. Additional volunteers are needed to continue to strengthen the MRC Program, and it is hoped that in 2017 the Murray Ridge Center Special Olympics Program will be better than ever!

Murray Ridge to Operate a Point of Distribution in the Case of Certain Emergencies

In the event of a county-wide health emergency requiring the distribution of medicine or treatment, Murray Ridge Center, in conjunction with the Lorain County General Health District, will operate a temporary point of distribution (POD) to provide medicine or treatments to consumers (people with developmental disabilities who have been determined eligible for services from the Lorain County Board of Developmental Disabilities), and their immediate care givers. Family members who live in households with children and adults with developmental disabilities will be eligible to receive medication/treatment from the Murray Ridge Center closed POD. Caregivers assigned at the time of POD operation to work with individuals with developmental disabilities who do not live with family will also be eligible to receive medicine/ treatment from the Murray Ridge Center POD for themselves and members of their immediate households. Should the need to operate a Murray Ridge Center POD occur, specifics will be communicated on the Murray Ridge Center Facebook page, on our website, and/or through other local media or communications.





Healthy Habits and Tips

Yogurt and Antibiotic Therapy

Antibiotics are used to destroy bacteria that cause



infections. While they are destroying the "bad" bacteria, they may also destroy the "good" bacteria that help you maintain a healthy digestive tract. There have been several studies that have shown that adding yogurt to your diet may help to counteract

this. Yogurt may interfere with the absorption of the antibiotic, so it is important to have the yogurt a minimum of 3 hours after the antibiotic. For example, if you take an antibiotic in the morning and at night, have your yogurt in the afternoon. If you take an antibiotic 3 times a day (9am, 3pm, 9pm), have your yogurt at noon.

Bee Stings

- 1. Remove the stinger by scraping with your fingernail. Do not remove the stinger with tweezers.

 Squeezing releases more of the poison into your body. A stinger that is not removed continues to release venom into your body for as long as 20 minutes.
- 2. Wash the area thoroughly with soap and water
- 3. Apply an ice pack for 20 minutes to relive the swelling and pain. May repeat as necessary. The swelling should be gone within 24 hours.

SIGNS OF AN ALLERGIC REACTION: Difficulty breathing, coughing, complaints of a headache, rash at the site, swelling, losing consciousness.

The Lorain County Board of DD convened at 12:30 p.m. on June 24, 2016:

Jim Nagy, staff member and Mega Championship Wrestling wrestler, presented the Board with a donation from its Breaking Down Barriers 5 event held in May. The Board presented an Outstanding Achievement Award to William Hunt for taking 1st place in the category of Behavioral Sciences for 5 and 6th grade students and receiving a Superior rating at the State Science Fair. The second quarter Exceptional Service Award will be presented at the August Board Meeting. Superintendent Fisher updated the Board that designation of Administrator for the Meister Road home will be given to Christine Ash.
