Murray Ridge School Commencement 2013 began with a prelude by music teacher Nevan Eilbeck and a welcome by Director of Educational Services Dann Swift as he introduced the transferring students, Kyle Bourisseau, Patrick Butcher, Joseph Cechura, Grant Holbrook, Michael Lewis, Nicholas Vanche, and James Woods.

The Murray Ridge Bell Choir played "Lean on Me," and then Superintendent Fisher took the podium.

"This ceremony is called "commencement" because, while it may be the end of your formal schooling, it marks the beginning of a lifetime of continued learning, new opportunities, and new choices," Dr. Fisher said. "You each possess unique gifts that will not only lead you to get the most out of your lives, but will also lead you to continue to enhance the lives of others."

On June 4, 2013, seven Murray Ridge School students Lorain County Sheriff's captain James Drozdowski, the ceremony's keynote speaker, delivered an inspirational speech, congratulating the graduates on all they've accomplished throughout the years. "Today is your day to be recognized for your accomplishments and the goals you have achieved," Captain Drozdowski said. "This is just the beginning for these students. Our community is a better place because of these graduates."

"Bee" Safe This Summer!

With the onset of popsicle season comes bee season! Remember to be safe this summer and, should you feel the sting of a bee, use the following guidelines:

- Remove the stinger by scraping with your fingernail. Do not remove the stinger with tweezers. Squeezing releases more of the poison into your body. A stinger that is not removed continues to release venom into your body for as long as 20 minutes.
- Wash the area thoroughly with soap and water.
- Apply an ice pack for 20 minutes to relieve the swelling and pain; swelling should be gone within 24 hours.

BOARD ROOM BRIEFING

The Lorain County Board of DD convened at 12:30 p.m. on May 31, 2013:

Jim Nagy, MRC staff member and Mega Championship Wrestler, presented Friends of Murray Ridge with a \$1,365.00 donation from its Breaking Down Barriers III event held in May. The Board approved, for submission to the Lorain County Commissioners, a tentative agreement with the OAPSE, Local 771, for the period 07/01/2013 - 06/30/2016. Superintendent Fisher discussed topics for upcoming strategic planning. An update on the Ohio Association of County Boards revealed a new Executive Director has been hired; Bridget Gargan will begin this position on 7/8/13. In other business, the Murray Ridge Support Group (MRSG) reported that there will be no dances in July and August; the last dance will be held on 6/21/13 for the year. MRSG also reported that new officers have been elected for the coming year, that the group helped finance the school's senior prom, and that a Giant Eagle gift card donation was made to a Lorain family in the previous month.
