

Attorney Mary Bresnicky McKee, an Oberlin resident who works out of the Firm's Sheffield Village office in Lorain County, not only represents Social Security Disability and Veterans' Disability claimants, but also offers special needs estate planning to help families get and keep government benefits, including guardianship, pre-application advice for parents of adult children, and special needs trusts. As a parent of a son with Down syndrome, she shares many of the same concerns her clients have. Now a shareholder, Mary graduated from Yale magna cum laude in 1982 and from Notre Dame Law School in 1985, where she was a Legal Aid intern with the Older Adult Impact Project in South Bend, Indiana. Mary's 25+ years of legal

experience include working for a Social Security Disability and personal injury firm in Philadelphia, and serving as a staff attorney with the Massachusetts Department of Insurance in Boston. She then worked with the General Counsel of the federal Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) review commission in Washington, D.C., before returning to her native Ohio to represent disabled claimants and their families. Mary continues to receive invitations to give talks and write articles for state and local bar associations, as well as for parent and disability support groups. A member of the Lorain County and Cleveland Metropolitan Bar Associations, she is accredited by the Department of Veterans Affairs to represent VA disability claimants and belongs to the National Organization of Social Security Claimants' Representatives (NOSSCR).

The Lorain County Board of DD convened at 12:30 p.m. on May 30, 2014:

Jim Nagy, MRC staff member and Mega Championship Wrestler, presented Friends of Murray Ridge with a \$1,606.24 donation from its Breaking Down Barriers 4 event held in May; Superintendent Amber Fisher presented Jim with a plaque acknowledging his years of dedication to the event. The Board discussed the recent conference in Columbus on Employment First. Director of Business John Bonko presented the tax budget; the Board unanimously approved. The Board also unanimously approved the following policy revisions: *Governing Rules and Regulations*; *Agency Chain of Command*; and *Separation*. In other news, the Murray Ridge Support Group will hold an educational program on June 9 (see flyer on p. 5); the MRSG will hold a meeting on June 5 and it's last dance until September will be held on June 20.
