BOARD ROOM BRIEFING

The Lorain County Board of DD convened at 6:30 p.m. on May 22, 2017:

Superintendent Fisher provided the Board with a review of the Governing Rules and Regulations. Director of Education, Dann Swift, presented a rescission of the Board Policy *Wellness - Murray Ridge School; and a* replacement policy, *Murray Ridge School Wellness Policy; both were unanimously approved.* The Board unanimously established the dollar amount that the Family Support Parent Committee is authorized to approve in the third quarter of 2017. Superintendent Fisher updated the Board regarding the State Biennium Budget, and announced that the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services has extended the final date for compliance with its waiver settings rule provisions (requiring community-based services) to 3/17/22. Director of Community Education and Volunteers Jennifer Judkins gave a presentation on the Agency's 50 year anniversary initiative, *50 Acts of Giving Back.* In other business, it was reported that the Murray Ridge Support Group (MRSG) will have a dance on June 16. There will be no Board meeting in July.
