

Eighteen months ago, Murray Ridge School teacher **Nick Kish** and his class of young entrepreneurs embarked on a fundraising mission to buy much-needed communication devices for students at the School. After negotiating a discount from a local, socially-conscious Marco's Pizza, Kish's class sold slices of pizza at a modest profit to Murray Ridge staff. At \$1.50 per slice, these delicious lunches were still a bargain, and Kish's class was able to raise \$800 toward the cost of a communication device for student Jimmy Woods.

BOARD ROOM BRIEFING

The Lorain County Board of MR/DD convened at 12:30 p.m. on February 27, 2009:

President Hunt requested a resolution by the Board members to accept the agency's 2009 Program And Expenditure Plan, barring any substantive changes as a result of the public hearing. The resolution passed unanimously. Superintendent Fisher updated the Board on state funding and the impact of the Stimulus Plan recently approved by Congress. While underlining the fact that some details are as yet not clear, Dr. Fisher noted that Ohio could anticipate an 8.5% increase to the Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (FMAP), which is the federal share of Medicaid covered services. For Murray Ridge, this could lead to an infusion of some \$1,411,000 per year (retroactive to 2008) through 2010. It is anticipated that this increase will be offset in part by further reductions in state funding. Dr. Fisher cautioned also, that this anticipated FMAP increase is not permanent and will expire at the same time that the hold harmless period for the loss of the Tangible Personal Property Tax (TPP) will start to be phased out. The hold harmless on the TPP elimination accounts for approximately \$1.6M/year in Murray Ridge Center funding. State funding for tax equity and the non-federal share for services associated with the Martin lawsuit are expected to be sustained in the next state biennium budget.
