Thank you to all who came out for great food, great company, and a worthy cause!









Lorain County Commissioners Proclaim March as "DD Awareness Month"

The Lorain County Commissioners adopted a resolution on March 5, 2014, declaring the month of March as "Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month" in Lorain County.

Three program participants accompanied Superintendent Amber Fisher to share their stories and to thank the Commissioners for their support of the Lorain County Board of Developmental Disabilities (LCBDD), more commonly known as Murray Ridge Center.

Christopher (CJ) Ackley, a student in the primary wing at Murray Ridge School, thanked the commissioners for their support. Benji Lewis, an active participant in Murray Ridge's Community Employment Program, shared his job responsibilities and love of Special Olympics with the crowd. And Juanita Young, a resident at the East College Group Home in Oberlin, shared her love of volunteering and extra-curricular activities.

During the meeting, Dr. Fisher also highlighted the services that more than 2,000 Lorain county citizens with developmental disabilities receive from Murray Ridge Center.

For example, the Early Intervention program served 680 children from birth to three years of age in 2013, and Murray Ridge School educated 161 students. Murray Ridge Center provided day services and/or work experience for more than 1,000 adults in one of the three Murray Ridge Opportunity/Vocational Centers, several community employment enclaves operated by the Murray Ridge Production Center, or in other locations throughout the community. Residential services were provided to 547 individuals, many of whom require this care due to deceased parents and/or elderly family caregivers. Also in 2013, the Family Support program assisted 685 Lorain County families with the care of a relative with developmental disabilities.

Since 1979, agencies across the country have formally recognized the abilities of persons with Developmental Disabilities (DD) every March. Throughout the month, efforts were made to help the public become more aware of people with developmental disabilities, the accomplishments and potentials of these individuals, and the programs and services available to them. Ohio proudly participates in this tradition and Lorain County's Murray Ridge Center is eager to support this effort.

Posters announcing DD Awareness Month will be displayed in libraries, community buildings, and places of worship across Lorain County throughout the month of March.

Thank you to all who work throughout the month of March - and all year long - to help educate the community about developmental disabilities, and encourage all to focus on *abilities* first!

BOARD ROOM BRIEFING

The Lorain County Board of DD convened at 12:30 p.m. on February 28, 2014:

Superintendent Fisher reported to the Board that the Lorain County Commissioners will declare the month of March to be "Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month" in Lorain County, and outlined a number of ways the agency would celebrate the month throughout the county. Board Member Henry Patterson gave a report on the Public Relations Committee meeting held February 21, 2014. Superintendent Fisher gave a report on the newly formed Socialization Committee. Superintendent Fisher requested approval of a resolution to adopt the 2014 Annual Action Plan Programs and Expenditures, contingent upon no substantial changes indicated as a result of information gathered in Public Forum on March 3, 2014. The Board unanimously approved the resolution. Following this, a 2013 expenditure update was given. The Board unanimously approved revisions to policies on *Addressing Major Unusual Incidents & Unusual Incidents to Ensure Health, Welfare & Continuous Improvement* and Management/Confidential Staff *Vacation Leave*. Murray Ridge Support Group member George Gedid announced that the next meeting would be on March 7 and the next dance will be March 14.
