Consumer Spotlight: Bobby Farmer

Murray Ridge Center is fortunate to have many adult program participants who have been with us for decades. Such is the case with Bobby Farmer, who was with the agency before it was Murray Ridge, before we had adult programs...even before we had a school.

In 1967, the Ohio Senate passed Amended S.B. 169, which created county boards of MRDD, and charged them with serving adults and children with developmental disabilities.

Around that time, Bobby

began receiving services from the newly formed Lorain County Board of MRDD. He was part of the Lorain City Schools system but attended class in a small building behind Longfellow Middle School for children with similar learning disabilities. As Bobby tells it, his father was approached by a man and woman working for the LCBMRDD, who suggested Bobby use its services.

Bobby left his small class and began attending a new school. They met in a small church, and later left that church for a bigger church that could hold the increasing number of students.

"It was so different. At my old school, I was beaten up a lot; things were thrown at me and kids were mean to me because I was different," Bobby remembered. "When I started at the new school, it felt like I was home. I was around people like me. It made me feel like I had another family."

In 1967, Bobby became part of the groundbreaking ceremony for the new Murray Ridge School in Elyria. There he learned valuable life skills, such as cooking, cleaning, and money management. After graduation,

he began at the first "workshop" which was run in a nursing home behind the jail on Murray Ridge Road. Later, what was then known as the Elyria Workshop (now the Elyria Opportunity/Vocational Center) was built, and Bobby moved over there to learn vocational and social skills.

"I learned how to act, how to respect others, and how to work and make money," he said.


Bobby eventually moved over to the Lorain adult day center when it was built, and there he met and fell in love with his future wife, Darlene. Bobby and Darlene moved to Kentucky for a few years, then moved back to Lorain due to

Darlene's medical issues. This year, they will celebrate their 12 year anniversary.

During his courtship with Darlene, Bobby started experimenting with painting, something he had never tried. Bobby quickly realized that he had incredible talent, and began painting animals and scenery almost exclusively.

"At first I didn't want to share my artwork with other people," he said. "But I had to quit being afraid and worrying about what people think of it. I had a lot of people outside of Murray Ridge telling me that there was no way I did that art because I am mentally retarded. But I did. It's mine."

Bobby now has his artwork

on display throughout Lorain County at the local libraries and in our adult Opportunity/Vocational Centers. He has found that, although he has a disability, it has no influence on his many abilities. And his passion for art, for life, and for other people has shown what a truly remarkable person Bobby Farmer has become.

"I used to hate being marked as a 'handicap' person. I was embarrassed. But you know what? I am who I am. I used to be very bitter about that, but I'm not anymore. Somewhere along the way, I grew up. I like who I am."


