Pen Pal Program Opens Communication Between School and OVC

Murray Ridge School students are taught functional life skills, preparing them for life and work after graduation. Cheryl wanted students to hear first-hand experiences from Adult Program participants so that they might get a better understanding of future options. Penni found that adults from the OVCs were interested in what was going on at the school. So, what better way to bring these groups together than to build the relationship between OVC and school?

"I thought the consumers could kind of serve as mentors to my students," Cheryl said. "Our kids and the consumers see the same people all the time; this is a way to meet new people."

The students and adults began writing letters to each other in September, and continued to write and receive letters on a monthly basis. The letters discussed upcoming holidays, events at the school or OVC, family events, likes and dislikes, etc. Cheryl found that, in addition to her students enjoying the task, they were also working towards Individual Education Plan (IEP) goals. Penni worked with the

Both Penni and Cheryl watched as the adults and students flourished in this program.

Penni agreed. "I feel that this collaboration of students and consumers was brilliant! It gave the adults the responsibility of writing letters and also opened up their minds on the topics they wanted to share and talk about. I am looking forward to next
