


Superintendent Amber Fisher singing the praises of the Murray Ridge School 2023 Graduating Class

REMEMBERING HELEN JONES (WOODSON)

Founder of Murray Ridge Choraleers

While Helen's tenure at Murray Ridge ended more than three decades ago, she left a lasting legacy as the founder of our celebrated Murray Ridge Choraleers. Helen began her Murray Ridge career at our school, but later transferred into our Adult Services Program, where she helped teach basic academics and living skills. Known for her ability to come up with new ideas and creative ways to teach, Helen soon organized a choral group of Adult Program participants. As many of her singers didn't read, Helen worked with them on ways to memorize songs; while they sang, she accompanied them on the piano. The Choraleers, who have been called "the original Murray Ridge ambassa-

dors," played in venues across Northeast Ohio, reportedly performing up to 50 times per year! After Helen departed Murray Ridge for other adventures, the Choraleers continued to practice and perform regularly at community events. Although the COVID epidemic put the Choraleers on pause, we are looking forward to getting the group 'up and singing' soon. With the news of Helen's recent passing, those who knew her are taking time to cherish her memory, and the Murray Ridge Family wishes to recognize and pay tribute to this remarkable woman, who was a pioneer in showcasing the talents and contributions of people with developmental disabilities.






Nominations Sought for Exceptional Service Awards
