





Boardroom Briefing

The Lorain County Board of Developmental Disabilities convened at 6:30 p.m. on September 25, 2023

Murray Ridge Program Specialist Jim Nagy, on behalf of Mega Championship Wrestling (MCW), presented a check for \$1,220.00; this donation was the proceeds from the 2023 Breaking Down Barriers wrestling event, the eleventh annual MCW fundraiser for the Friends of Murray Ridge. The 2022 Strategic Plan Progress Report was adopted. The Board passed a resolution that, effective February 26, 2024, the Lorain County Board of Developmental Disabilities will no longer provide Murray Ridge Adult Services other than Supported Employment services at the Elyria Opportunity and Vocational Center (EOVC); impacted individuals will be notified of options, and after February of 2024 those not enrolled on Medicaid waivers will be able to receive Murray Ridge Adult Services at the Oberlin OVC or Lorain OVC. The Board appointed Board Member Keith Boey as delegate and Superintendent Amber Fisher as alternate to the 2023 delegate assembly of the Ohio Association of County Boards Serving People with Developmental Disabilities.
