Boardroom Briefing

The Lorain County Board of Developmental Disabilities convened at 6:30 p.m. on March 25, 2024

Superintendent Fisher explained anticipated revenues and variable expenses of the agency's school year 2023/2024 Preschool Program, and gave a historical overview of subsidies and charges for Murray Ridge Preschool Program participants with special needs; the Board established rate structures for parents of typically developing children and school districts that place students in the Murray Ridge Preschool Program for the 2024/2025 school year. The Board unanimously approved minor revisions to its policies on Early Intervention and Early Intervention Referral to the Help Me Grow (HMG) Program. Dr. Fisher discussed upcoming events, including the twelfth annual Breaking Down Barriers wrestling event, a fundraiser for the Friends of Murray Ridge, to be held on Saturday May, 04, 2024.
