On the Air and Behind the Scenes!



Boardroom Briefing

The Lorain County Board of Developmental Disabilities convened at 6:30 p.m. on April 14, 2025.

Superintendent Fisher explained anticipated revenues and variable expenses of the agency's school year 2024/2025 Preschool Program, and gave a historical overview of subsidies and charges for Murray Ridge Preschool Program participants with special needs; the Board established rate structures for parents of typically developing children and school districts that place students in the Murray Ridge Preschool Program for the 2025/2026 school year. Agency calendars were approved for July 01, 2025 – June 30, 2026; these are posted on the Agency website.
