Participants will learn how to create responsive, inclusive environments that support learners of all abilities while gaining practical strategies to foster emotional literacy, co-regulation, and self-regulation in the classroom. Participants will be provided with information, tools, and strategies to begin a new circle time routine and/or improve existing circle time routines and activities. These activities will create more opportunities for engagement in the circle. <p><b><u>What We Might Miss: Spotting Subtle Signs of Level 1 ASD in Young Children (OA-L1)</u></b> (AT# 144063)</p> <p>Participants will learn how to spot early and subtle signs of Level 1 autism spectrum disorder (ASD) in toddlers and young children, highlighting real life examples. This training helps educators recognize behaviors like masking, scripted language, social mimicry, and other signs of atypical development that may be missed or misunderstood.
